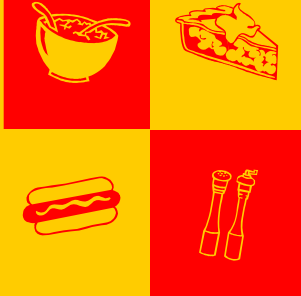

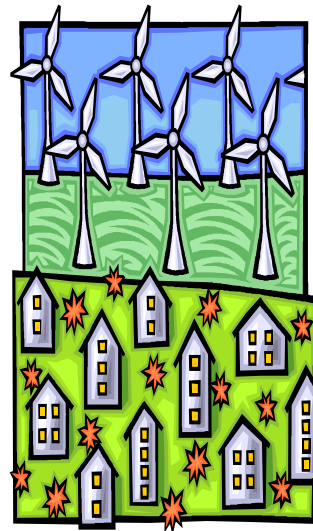
SCIENCE MUSEUM
